The meeting of the Board of Public Safety Commission was held at 7:00 p.m. on the 5th day of March 2018 in the Public Safety Building for the transaction of such business that may come before the Commission.

ROLL CALL

Commissioner Chair Beermann opened the meeting. Administrative Assistant Llorián commenced with the roll call. The entire commission was present.

HEAR CITIZENS

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Ashcraft made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 4, 2017 meeting. Commissioner Beermann seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Commissioner Sullivan made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 3, 2018 meeting. Commissioner Ashcraft seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

AMENDMENT TO THE AGENDA

Commissioner Ashcraft made a motion to ask a question regarding the weekly report to be added to new business. Commissioner Lund seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Commissioner Lund made a motion to discuss medication drop-off at the station to new business. Commissioner Ashcraft seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

ALDERMANIC REPORT

Alderman Sansone stated that elections in Des Peres will be April 3rd for mayor and three (3) aldermen. He concluded that the mayor and two (2) of the aldermen are running unopposed.

BUDGET

Chief Krumm stated final numbers for the 2017 budget will be in at the next meeting as some bills are still coming in. He stated that 2018 budget is in good shape with dues and memberships bills typically come in at the beginning of the year. Chief Krumm stated that capital improvement costs are low this year as the fire truck was purchased out of the 2017 budget. He added that a cardiac monitor defibrillator, a recorder for the interview room, two (2) vehicles and two (2) sets of fire gear have been ordered from the 2018 capital improvement fund. A committee is currently evaluating in-car camera systems for purchase this year.

Chief Krumm stated that the department is also preparing bids for the purchase of four new garage door openers for the apparatus bay and ballistic shields & helmets that have been approved in this year's budget.

NEW BUSINESS

Department Assessment Analysis Report for 2017

Lt. Willoughby distributed to the commission with the department assessment analysis report and crime victims information. He stated to the commission to contact him if they have any questions.

Lt. Willoughby concluded that the CALEA mock assessment is scheduled for April 4th and full on sight assessment is tentatively scheduled for November 26th.

Resident Camera Program

Chief Krumm presented the commission information on resident camera program. He stated that the resident camera program allows residents and business owners to register locations and capabilities of their security camera systems with the department. He stated that using this information when a crime occurs could help the department collect video evidence and follow up on leads. He stated that currently Florissant Police Department has such a program in place.

Commissioner Ashcraft made a motion to implement the resident camera program in the City of Des Peres. Commissioner Sullivan seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Insurance Service Office Audit for 2018

Chief Krumm stated that they are scheduled for an Insurance Service Office (ISO) audit currently scheduled for August of this year. He stated that it has been fourteen (14) years since the last audit.

Captain Hall stated that the department currently has a rating of four (4) score, with one (1) being the highest and best rating and ten (10) being the lowest. He stated he hopes to improve to a rating of three (3). He concluded that he thinks the department will do well on the audit.

Weekly Report

Commissioner Ashcraft asked about status of the department pick-up truck.

Capt. Hall stated that the vehicle has been upgraded to enhance the department response and potentially assist with the departments ISO rating. The service company is equipped with supply and fire attack hose, power tools, hand tools, additional lighting, and a multipurpose ladder. He concluded that the service company is automatically dispatched to any incident involving a structure (fire alarm, gas leak, reported fire, etc., areas where it is difficult for the pumper and ambulance to maneuver, and any incident involving parking structures.

Medication Drop-off

Commissioner Lund asked if the City would consider making Public Safety a medication drop-off location.

Chief Krumm stated that the department participates in two (2) DEA sponsored medication take back events at the Lodge every year in April and October. He stated the department participates in the DEA program because, after collection, DEA handles the disposal of the medication. He concluded that other surrounding departments have removed themselves from taking medications as it has too dangerous to manage.

Chief Krumm concluded that there are drug disposal bags available for individual to take and dispose of their medication at home

OLD BUSINESS

Community Exchange Zones

Chief Krumm stated that the community exchange zone cameras are up and signs for the two spots designated for the zone will be installed soon. He concluded that the cameras need to be repositioned on the two (2) spots.


CALEA Update
