

The Department of Public Safety reported that the number of dead or injured deer and deer incidents involving a deer and automobile, doubled during 2015 to roughly 40 incidents. Based on that evidence, the City decided to undertake its first deer census to obtain an objective analysis of the size of our deer herd.

White Buffalo Inc. completed the census in late January, identifying a deer density of less than 10 deer per sq mile east of I-270 and a density of 40 deer per square mile west of I-270. To put these numbers into context, the Department of Conservation has identified a threshold of 20 deer per square mile in an urban area as a sustainable density without significant damage to the environment. In contrast, our neighbor to the north, Town & Country, has a density west of I-270 of roughly 80 deer per sq mile. At this time, the Board has decided to continue to monitor the number of deer incidents and to conduct a deer census again in 2017 to reassess the situation based on the facts and trends as presented.

It's that time of year when the General Assembly is back in session and it appears no one (especially cities in St. Louis County) are safe! We have a good working relationship with our State Senator Eric Schmitt. We have a new State Representative Dean Plocher – a Des Peres resident, and I spent some time with him in Jefferson City in early February to establish what I believe will be an open and honest relationship. Both lawmakers state that they love to hear from their constituents on issues that affect every-day Missourians!

Last session a major focus was Senate Bill 5 (reforming municipal courts) which limited court revenues from minor traffic violations to no more than 12.5% of total general revenue; limited municipal court fines to no more than \$300; mandated courts impose "alternative sentencing" for those convicted who cannot pay their fines; and mandated that all St. Louis County Police Departments be accredited or certified within six (6) years by either the Missouri Police Chief's Association or become internationally accredited under CALEA. This session, the General Assembly wants to further reduce the maximum fine courts impose to \$200 and to have the cap apply to both traffic tickets and other municipal ordinance violations such as property maintenance. These restrictions have not been an issue for Des Peres, as our total court revenues for 2015 were less than 2.6% of general revenues in 2015 and our Department of Public Safety expects to be full certified by the Missouri Police Chief's Associations by the time this newsletter goes to print. Our most pressing concern this year in the General Assembly remains protecting our sales tax base, which represents 63.6% of Des Peres revenue this fiscal year. The primary issue involves sales tax sharing, with multiple bills filed to change the sharing formula – which historically has been to the detriment of point-of-sale cities like Des Peres. The POOL cities, which want more sharing, have engaged with a lobbyist as have the cities of Chesterfield and Fenton to push for "reform" and "more equitable sharing". St. Louis County, which receives nearly \$170 million more in sales tax than they generate, is naturally, fighting to protect their revenues. Both my office and the City Administrator, are monitoring that legislation and are actively engaged in ongoing discussions to preserve your sales tax money! As Mayor, I have pledged to my fellow elected officials, to work with the County and other cities toward a compromise to end this battle over money so that we can return to discussing partnerships and cooperation as a way to make this county better!

Lastly, I am happy to report that the Village Bar lives on! The long-standing Des Peres icon is under new ownership and will continue operation!

Emerald Ash Borer in Missouri Urban Canopy

Insects can take a devastating toll on the country's urban canopy. Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)- a green jewel beetle native to eastern Asia has been found not too far from Des Peres. It feeds primarily on Ash species native to North America. Because very little was depicted in its native range of eastern Asia most of the research and work on its biology is focusing on North America, primarily the northeastern portion of US. Local governments in North America are attempting to control it by monitoring its spread, diversifying tree species, insecticide injections, and biological controls. It has not been identified in Des Peres, but because it is so near we are taking a proactive approach. We have identified where all our Ash trees are located throughout the city, rated them on how they are looking, scouting to see if there is any evidence of the insect, removing if tree is in a stressful state, and using pesticides where applicable. The City's Public Works Department has a busy summer ahead, filled with street improvement projects.

The first project to start will be cracksealing. Nearly all of the concrete streets west of I-270 will be cracksealed this year, with other streets following in future years. Cracksealing is part of an overall pavement maintenance plan, preventing water and debris from getting into the joints and causing deterioration. While Des Peres has self-performed some cracksealing in the past, this will be our first widespread program. Work is expected to take place in March/April, weather permitting.

The next project to kick off will be our annual sidewalk replacement project. While trees improve our quality of life, beautify our neighborhoods, improve air quality, and provide traffic calming, their roots also tend to lift sidewalks, causing trip hazards. Thus, every year, our Streets Division makes temporary repairs by grinding the concrete or installing cold-patch asphalt. Later on, we bid out the replacement of deficient slabs. This year, our contractor will replace approximately 200 sidewalk slabs in the Spring Valley neighborhood: Sunny Terrace Drive, Bent Springs Drive, Brook Springs Court, Clearbrook Drive, and Bentbrook Court. In each case, the contractor will remove the existing slabs, trim tree roots, and pour new slabs. In addition, we started using a new product called TripStop last year, which keeps joints from becoming trip hazards again in the future. Work is expected to take place in April/May.


Three streets are scheduled for complete concrete replacement: Belle Meade Road (east of Tricorn Lane), Briar Fork Court, and Lawnwood Drive. Due to the extensive failures of the existing pavement, the concrete street and underlying soil will be removed, and a new cross-section will be constructed, consisting of 4" of rock and 8" of concrete. In each case, half the street will be removed and replaced at a time, to mitigate the effect of construction on homeowners. Work is expected to take place in early summer.

Following the replacement of concrete streets, we will also be replacing slabs on streets such as Ballas Trails Drive, Ballas Park Drive, and Fairoyal Drive. The magnitude of the slab replacement project will depend upon pricing we receive when we bid the concrete street replacement project. Work is expected to take place in late summer.

The largest project of all is the street resurfacing project, which includes sixteen streets. The streets of Bayberry Hills (Kendon, Bayberry, Marlann, and Hargrove) and Roger Lane will receive new concrete rolled curbs and an asphalt overlay. The asphalt streets in Dougherty Lakes (Beaver Dam, Crab Thicket, Stump Road, Stump Court, Camberwell, Hollyhead Drive, and Hollyhead Court), will see their curb ramps upgraded to ADA standards, then the old asphalt will be milled off and new asphalt installed. Winslow Lane, Serama, Breezeridge, and Fawnridge will have their asphalt removed and replaced. Work is expected to start after Memorial Day.

American Red Cross Heroes Award Given to Department of Public Safety

On December 29, 2015 the American Red Cross notified the department that the following members of A Shift; Lt. Willoughby, Sgt. Severs, Cpl. Franey, PSO/Paramedic Roettering, PSO Kipfer, PSO Simmons and Firefighter/Paramedic Williams were selected by the American Red Cross Heroes Committee to receive the 2016 Emergency Medical Assistance Award for their actions described below.

On 23 August, 2015 at Des Peres Lodge an eight year old boy was taken out of the indoor pool and was not conscious or breathing. Lt. Willoughby, Sgt. Severs, and PSO Simmons arrived on the scene almost immediately and took over CPR, rescue breathing, and use of the AED.

Shortly thereafter, the crews of 2814 and 2817 arrived on scene and PSO Roettering started an IV while Paramedic Williams secured the airway. Cpl. Franey and PSO Kipfer assisted in packaging the patient for transport to Mercy Hospital.

Upon arrival at the hospital the victim was doing much better and was given a positive prognosis. It was the result of the tremendous "team effort" that this group displayed that contributed to this positive outcome.

We want to thank all our first responders for the heroic work that they do each and every day. Congratulations to the A Shift for this outstanding recognition!
